Ramsheth Thakur Library Report

The Ramsheth Thakur Library of the college is working with the objective to make available the necessary books required and prescribed for various courses in the college along with nurturing literary and creative minds. Students, teaching and non-teaching staff members and alumni of the college avail the library service on a regular basis. The availability of a large number of reference books in various disciplines is the unique feature of our library.

Today the library has as many as 82,525 books valued at Rs. 9598223/-About 7481 books are available in the library for the Junior Section. In addition the library has subscribed to 86 periodicals, journals and 25 Newspapers for the updated resources.

The library is fortunate to receive valuable guidance from the Principal of the college Dr. A.K. Patil, Vice-Principal Dr. N.N. Shere and Officer on Special Duty Prof. S.B. Datar. The Library Committee Members Prof. T.D. Walde, Dr. Sonali Patil, Mrs. V.S. Erande and Prof. K.M. Kulkarni have also contributed in the proper functioning of the library.

The issuing section of the library is open from 8.00 a.m to 4.00 p.m. A number of books for 11th to P.G. Classes are available in this section. Students can avail textbooks, reference books as well as additional reading material from this section. During the Covid-19 pandemic, scanned copies of chapters from textbooks were provided to students through the media like whatsapp and E-mail.

The Reading section is open from 8.00 am to 5.00 p.m. Here students can access textbooks, reference books, books on various competitive examinations as well as various periodicals, newspapers and old question paper sets.

The reading section can accommodate 80 students, however, in the pandemic situation, only 50% Students were admitted in the section, following the guidelines for social distancing and Covid appropriate behaviour.

Under the Book Bank Scheme, students from economically weaker section can borrow necessary textbooks at one third value of the original price and use them for the entire year.

The library also provides digital resources like e-books, e-journal e-magazines along with the traditional hard copies. The library can boast of 7,64,300 e-books, 6000 e-journals and 500 e-magazines. All this information regarding the availability of books and other open educational resources is made available on the college website.

We thank Dr. Satish Shripad Thigale, Prof. Mrs. Gauri Lonkar and Mrs. Maduwanti Bhagwat for donating books to the library during the year.

National Service Scheme Report

The role of the National Service Scheme unit in the overall personality development of the college students is very significant. Following the motto 'Not Me, But You', the unit organised various awareness programmes, throughout the year, with strict observation of Covid-19 guidelines. These include distribution of face masks to the needy, Celebration of Yoga Day through the virtual medium, cleanness drive, Voter Awareness campaign, AIDS awareness Programme, Campus and Beach Cleaning Drive, Swachha Bharat Abhiyan and many other.

During the Covid-19 Pandemic in the year 2020-21 the N.S.S. unit distributed face masks among needy people like vegetable and fruit vendors, auto rickshaw drivers, workers on construction sites from the adopted villages Mani Bute, Sagaon, Talavali as well as from Alibag. The programme officers conducted guidance sessions on preventive measures against the corona disease. The volunteers created awareness through posters and videos.

Yoga Day was celebrated, through the virtual mode on 21st June 2021 by the unit. All the volunteers practiced yoga at their homes and sent video clips of the same for uploading on the college website. On August 2021, under the Swasth Bharat Abhiyan, students were given oath for tobacco free life.

An online programme under spit free India was organised wherein students were guided on health and were also given to follow hygienic habits. The Red Ribbon club was established in the college under the guidance of 'AIDS Prevention and Control Cell, Alibag, and an awareness programme was conducted through it.

A Blood Donation Camp was organised in the college, jointly by N.S.S. and N.C.C. units with the co-operation of Civil Hospital Alibag on 25th February 2021.

47 bags of blood were collected whereas 160 students got their haemoglobin level checked.

On the occasion of the National Voters' Day, on 25th January 2021, the N.S.S. Programme Officers guided the students on voter awareness and persuaded the students to register their names in the electoral roll. The students were also given the oath to vote fearlessly without falling prey to any temptation.

On 15th March 2021, under the National Tuberculosis Eradication Programme an informative programme was organised jointly by the N.S.S. Unit and the District Tuberculosis Control Cell, Alibag. In this programme Mr. Satish Dantarao, District Programme Co-ordinator, Mr. Kirtikant Patil, Senior T.B. Supervisor and Mrs. Madhuri Patil guided the students about T.B. and also answered their queries and doubts.

On World Forest Day i.e. 21st March 2021, an Online Quiz was organised on the theme of Forest Conservation. About 544 students and teachers participated in the quiz, who were awarded participation certificates through e-mail. On 22nd March 2021, World Water Day was celebrated by organizing Poster Making Competition on the theme of 'Save Water'. Total 22 students participated in the competition and first three rank holders were awarded with attractive prizes and certificates.

In addition, the unit celebrated the Birth and Death Anniversaries of great National Heroes. All the programmes were conducted, strictly following the Covid-19 guidelines.

The unit is working under the guidance of Hon. Sanjay Datta Patil, Chairman, Janata Shiksha Mandal, Hon. Adv. Gautam Patil, Vice-Chairman, Hon. Ajit P. Shah, Secretary and Dr. Anil Patil, Principal of the college.

During the Academic year 2020-21 it was not possible to organize industrial visits and excursions. The Geography Dept. organized an online programme for the students with the help of power point presentation wherein they were provided valuable information about the cultural, geographical and historical tourist places in India. During the latter part of the year an online quiz for students was organized in which 43 students participated.

Students' Consumer Store

The J.S.M. College students' Consumer Store was established in the college after 3 years of the inception of the college, with the motto to provide educational material to the students on 'No Profit No Loss' basis. The store is registered vide Regd. No. REGD/ABG/CON/102/1964 dated 01/03/1964. From its inception to date, the students' consumer store has provided the necessary journals, files and other stationery materials at affordable prices. In recent years only science students are provided with necessary journals.

The students' consumer store operates from June to Sept. However, due to the Covid-19 Pandemic and Lockdown during the year 2020-21, no journals and books were provided to the students through the store.

The Audit for the Financial Year 2019-20 was completed in this year. In the coming days, the students' consumer store will be set up as per the rules of Co-operative Society.

Energy Conservation and Ecofriendly Campus Committee

The main aim of forming the Energy Conservation & Ecofriendly Campus Committee is to identify, consider and recommend strategies that will enhance environmental awareness and energy conservation in the college campus. The committee will also plan the efforts needed to develop an ecofriendly campus.

Keeping the above facts in consideration and making students aware about role of forest in human survival, the committee along with NSS unit and Department of Botany organized **Online Quiz Competition** on the occasion of **International Day of forest-2021** on 21st March 2021. The theme for this year was Forest restoration: a path to recovery and well-being. The competition got a huge response in the form of 544 participants. To all the participants' e-certificate were given.
