Total 93 Information Technology students responded for the feedback.

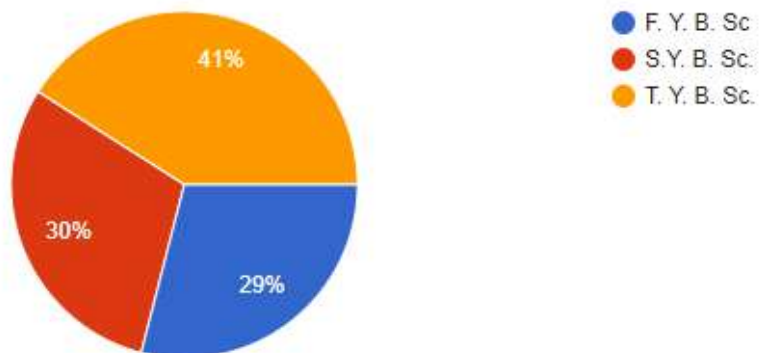

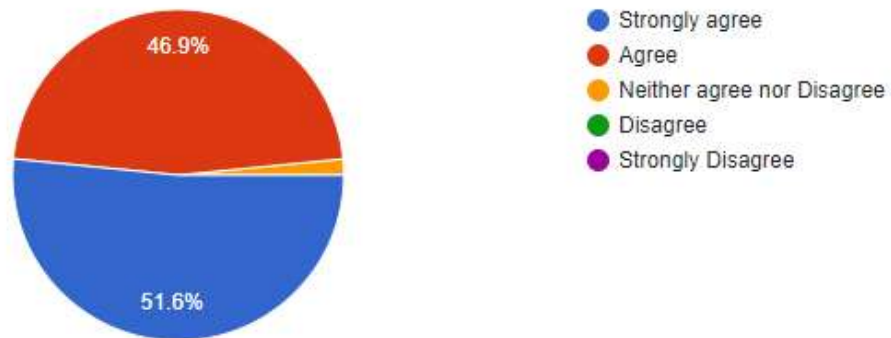

- More than 98.5 % of the staff members find a good balance between theory and Application.

We are happy to put the annual Report of our college for academic year 2022-23. Our college has taken consistent efforts to enhance the quality of organisation in terms of academic, co-curricular, curricular, research, and extension and outreach activities.

Following are the outcomes of the efforts taken during the academic year 2022-23


- Conducted Students satisfaction Survey for the academic year.
- Academic departments collected feedback from all stake holders and analysed the same to take the corrective measures.
- Faculty members of our college created video lectures, power point presentations, study material uploaded on LMS as a reference material for students.
- Examination committee conducted examination for UG and PG classes conducted smoothly as per the directives of the university.
- Internal Quality Assurance Cell and academic departments conducted 24 (06 national, 06 state, 12 local,) seminars / webinars / conferences during the year.
- 22 research paper publications, 05 chapters in edited book, 11 Paper presentations in various international and national conferences/ seminars are the major outcomes during the year.

- 02 new journals and 8000 e- magazines were subscribed by the college library during the year.

- College Development Committee approved the proposal of facility of cricket Net and Kabaddi ground and successfully completed both facilities during the year.
